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Summary of Findings

Christine Colette Kelly is a 59-year-old real estate agent and marketing professional with SAS, who lives in Holly Springs, NC. She is married to Charles, and the two operate a real estate company out of their home. Kelly is an immigrant from Canada, and it appears she became a US Citizen around mid-2014, when she registered to vote as a member of the Democratic Party. There is no indication that she participated in any elections prior to that time in any state or under any name.

In addition to their home in Holly Springs, the Kellys also own three parcels in Ashe County, NC, a rural section in the very northwestern edge of the state. These parcels include more than ten acres of land and a good-sized home on the property. It is unclear how much time they spend at the home, or if they receive rent, as Kelly's financial disclosure is not available for download on the North Carolina Ethics Commission website, but when we receive it, we will provide a supplemental memorandum with this information.

There is no indication that the Kellys have been delinquent at any time on property taxes in Wake or Ashe County. The Kellys, however, are somewhat controversial in their community. In 2011, when the Town of Holly Springs proposed a sidewalk in the Kellys' neighborhood, town officials tell us the two were opposed and even proposed putting crosswalks and sidewalks on the opposite side of the street. Eventually litigation ended with the Kellys received \$7,000 for the town to put sidewalks in front of their home.

A 2005 lawsuit by a contractor against them was found in their favor, and he was forced to pay the Kellys' attorney's fees. The suit alleged a verbal agreement for the construction of a separate garage and apartment unit, but the Kellys successfully argued that the agreement did not provide for additional percentages paid to the contractor directly.

Kelly opted to run for Town Council in 2017, and just days before the election, she stood before the council making allegations of ethics violations by members of the council, the mayor, and the town attorney. Notes in the meeting minutes indicate that outside counsel was brought in to review her allegations and determined they were unfounded. We believe, but have not confirmed, that the cost of the outside counsel hovered around \$10,000. In November 2017, she won a seat on the Holly Springs Town Council.

In 2021, rather than run for reelection, Kelly chose to run for mayor, a role she lost overwhelmingly in November 2021. Almost immediately after the defeat, she announced her intent to run for House District 37. In a three-way primary, she won with fewer than 70 votes more than her nearest opponent. That said, Kelly does not appear to be a prolific fundraiser. In her bid for Holly Springs Mayor in 2021, she raised less than \$11,000, and in her bid for House, to date, she reported less than \$30,000 raised.

According to *Ballotpedia*, Kelly is a Canadian Immigrant who attended college in Iowa before moving to North Carolina. Being an immigrant might explain why Kelly did not register to vote until mid-2014.

She earned a bachelor's degree in mathematics from the University of Waterloo in 1987 and a master of trust and wealth management from Campbell University in 2017. Kelly's career experience includes working at the SAS Institute in marketing, sales, and technical roles, as a licensed North Carolina real estate broker-in-charge, as president of Kelly & Kelly Services Inc., and as a local councilwoman. She has been associated with the League of Women Voters of Wake County, Holly Springs MLK Jr. Committee, and Holly Springs Rotary Club

Voter Registration

Kelly registered to vote in North Carolina on July 15, 2014, as a member of the Democratic Party (ID: 000100375761). It should be noted that this is 22 years after she claims to have moved to the area. Since 2014, she participated in twelve elections, consistently pulling a Democratic ballot.

Ashe County Property Taxes

With the exception of two tax payments due by September 2022, all property taxes in Ashe County are current and were paid without penalty back to 2013.

Civil Filings

In 2005, the Kellys were sued for \$20,000 by a contractor for a garage completed at their home. According to the complaint, the Kellys verbally agreed to the costs associated with the construction of the garage, including a percentage fee for the contractor. In their answer, the Kellys said they fired the contractor from the job after he began submitting periodic invoices for more and more money, exceeding the budget they had for their project. They completed the project and ordered additional materials for which the plaintiff was charging them through a separate vendor and in a

time period beyond what the parties had initially agreed upon. Ultimately, the Kellys were victorious in the suit, and the plaintiff was ordered to pay their attorney's fees, remove the lien on their home, and did not receive any additional money.

In 2011, the Town of Holly Springs proposed a sidewalk on Grigsby Avenue, including in front of the Kellys residence. According to a council member at the time, Kelly opposed the action and the city taking a small easement of their property via eminent domain and proposed the town complete the sidewalk up to their property line, install a crosswalk place sidewalk across the street to their property line and install an additional crosswalk back to their side of the street (entirely bypassing their property; the epitome of NIMBY-ism). In December 2011, the town sued to receive the easement and through a settlement, agreed to pay the Kellys \$7,000 in order to place a sidewalk in front of their home.

2017 City Council

Kelly placed first in a 7-way (plus write-in) race for Town of Holly Springs Council in November 2017. The top three vote recipients earned places on the council.

Just days before the election, Kelly made an on-record statement during a council meeting alleging members of the council, the mayor, and the town attorney committed ethics violations, possibly relating to Town Hall Commons project. Notes in the meeting indicate that an independent investigation found no evidence of wrongdoing. A council member notified us, and we are awaiting additional evidence, that the investigation may have cost as much as \$10,000.

Christine Kelly, 201 Grigsby Ave. – Ms. Kelly addressed the Council to say she believes there have been ethical violations by some Council members, the mayor, and town attorney.

Mr. Schifano advised Ms. Kelly that she was making serious charges under oath, and he gave her the opportunity to recant her allegations. She said she did not wish to recant. He pressed her to be specific in her charges. Ms. Kelly referenced sentences and paragraphs of the Town of Holly Springs Code of Ethics for Public Officials P-

21.2, alleging that various Council members (specifically, Councilmen Dickson and Cobb, Council woman Lee and Mayor Sears) and the town attorney had violated those provisions. She did not say with specificity how those provisions had been violated.

After much testimony that was not on the topic of the special exception use findings of fact, but was Ms. Kelly making allegations of public officials wrongdoing, Mr. Schifano advised Ms. Kelly that since she was including him in her allegations, she should file her grievances with the Town Manager, per the policy.

Ms. Kelly said she – as a candidate for public office who is subject to the same ethics policy – had signed the policy herself and would be expected to uphold those ethics.

Still under oath, Ms. Kelly submitted her grievances to the Town Manager.

(Off-Record Note: In the following days, it was determined that Ms. Kelly was alleging 53 separate instances of ethics violations. Independent counsel was hired to investigate the claims. The investigator found no basis for any of the claims.)

(On Record Testimony Resumed) Ms. Kelly said she felt that the Town Hall Commons Project should not move forward until the Village District Area Plan for downtown has been updated. She said this project appears to require the closing of Raleigh Street, and she said that should not be down until the VDAP is updated. She claimed that the closing of Raleigh Street is in the process without public notice.
