Summary of Findings

Elmer Floyd is a 79-year-old former legislator who lives in Fayetteville, NC. He is married to Dorothy, his second wife, and they reside in a home he purchased with his first wife, Peggy, in 1972. Floyd is retired from his work with the City of Fayetteville, and he also collects a pension from the State of North Carolina. His wife Dorothy works as a salesperson at Belk Department Store.

Floyd and his first wife, Peggy, divorced in the late 1980s. The two had one daughter, LaTonya, born in 1967, who was 21 at the time their divorce was finalized. While property records show that LaTonya and Peggy lived together in the 1990s, Floyd purchased LaTonya and her husband a home by the mid-2000s. The parcel is currently in Floyd and LaTonya's husband's name. In addition to this home and their primary residence, Floyd also owns a parcel in Rocky Mount, NC. He does not appear to have any financial issues tied to these parcels, except for a late property tax payment on the shared parcel that resulted in a \$21 fine.

Almost 20 years ago, Floyd struck a 12-year-old boy when pulling out of his driveway. The boy received a strained back, contusions, and a cut on his chin that resulted in stitches. Using a Guardian Ad Litem, the boy sued Floyd for medical bills. The parties settled for just over \$4,300 out of court. Besides this incident and his divorce, our searches did not yield any additional legal problems for Floyd. Both his ex-wife and his current wife had some minor legal issues, including a dismissed charge for selling alcohol to a minor (Peggy) and a dismissed charge for have a child not restrained in the backseat (Dorothy). Dorothy was also the subject of some civil cases in Cumberland County that appear to be credit card collections filings. We requested these cases, and any information received will be included in a supplemental memo.

As a candidate, Floyd ran for NC House losing in the primary on three occasions (2002, 2004, and 2006). In 2008, he finally succeeded through the primary, earning a spot in the NC House, as he did not face a general election opponent. Similarly, however, he faced two opponents in the 2020 primary election and lost to a challenger. He is not a prolific fundraiser, and frequently loans money to his committee. His daughter, as treasurer, is far from competent, showing accounting problems that do not add up, frequent audits reflecting these problems, and several waived penalties for late filings. In 2010, he was cited for failing to file two 48-hour reports. While one \$500 penalty was waived, another \$500 was outstanding until the State Board of Elections settled for \$50 in December 2011. It is unclear from his filings if the \$50 penalty was ever paid.

Floyd has not given to any federal candidates or committees, but in North Carolina, his contributions (outside of money given to his own committee) was limited to just more than \$2,200. When reviewing Floyd's contributions, we found more than 700 transactions, including dozens of outstanding loans (Appendix 1).

Marriage License

Floyd and Dorothy Bohannon applied for and filed a marriage license in Cumberland County indicating a December 27, 1997 wedding date. The two were married by Reverend Kim Nixon with Naomi and Hubert Siler serving as witnesses.

The license lists this as Floyd's second marriage (his first ended in divorce in September 1987). He indicates four years of college and that he is black. Dorothy is also marrying for the second time (her first marriage ended in divorce in April 1984). She is a high school graduate and is black.

We reviewed statements of economic interest filed by Floyd with the North Carolina Ethics Commission covering calendar years 2014 to 2021. While only the 2014 filing is complete, all other forms indicate no change.

- The Floyds borrowed \$14,500 from Wachovia Mortgage Company over 430 years at 7% interest on August 23, 1972 and secured on lots 100 and 101 of Rosehill Park Section 2.
- A request for notice of foreclosure sale, dated February 28, 1986, indicates that their mortgage was purchased by Allstate Enterprises Inc.
- Peggy Floyd conveyed her interest in the parcel at 207 Courtney Drive to Floyd via quit claim deed on February 20, 1990. At that time, it was valued at \$8,000
- Peggy Floyd served as Executrix of the Estate of Rosa L. Johnson and sold a parcel at 919 Ellis Street to Jaquelyn Chesney on January 27, 1993
- On May 1, 1990, Floyd and six other parties filed an application to register a business operating license under an assumed name, Associated contractors of Fayetteville. The business operated from 7021 Trevor Lane, Fayetteville, NC
- Peggy Floyd and her daughter, LaTonya, purchased a parcel in Cumberland County from David Scott Laymen and Bernice Kidd on June 28, 2001.
- On June 25, 2002, Allstate Enterprises Inc. released the \$14,500 loan signed by the Floyds on August 23, 1972
- Floyd appears, as a trustee with Ethel Clark for Williams Chapel Freewill Baptist Church, in a document borrowing \$32,000 from Augustus W. McIver and Eunice Brown Johnson Tyson on December 18, 2003
- A loan previously obtained by Peggy and Latonya Floyd totaling \$86,005.06 through Citi Mortgage Company Inc., was assigned to FirstKey Mortgage on July 12, 2018.

- Floyd and James H. Rose purchased a parcel at 2072 Seneca Drive, Fayetteville on December 14, 2021 for \$85,961. The 1,398 square foot parcel has four bedrooms and two bathrooms. The parcel was conveyed to them by Dorothy Floyd and LaTonya Monique Rose, their mutual spouses.

Property Tax Records – Cumberland County

In recent years, all taxes on homes owned by Floyd in Cumberland County are current and were paid on time, with one exception.

The Seneca Drive parcel a late payment for FY 2019 resulting in a minor, \$22.41 interest charge. It appears that taxes due on January 15, 2020 were paid on January 21, 2020.

Personal Property Taxes

Our requests for information about personal property resulted in verbal confirmation that taxes on a 2004 Nissan, a 2010 Nissan, and a 2013 Kia were paid in recent years without penalty.

Legal Issues

Our searches for traffic records tied to Floyd brought up several matches to an Elmer Ray Floyd, who was born in 1943 and lives in Greenville, NC. This man, who is a career criminal, is not the subject of this report, nor does he appear to be related to him. As a result, we found no instances of traffic filings naming Floyd as a party.

Family Law

Peggy Floyd petitioned for divorce from Floyd in October 1988, after more than twenty-two years of marriage. At the time of the filing, their daughter LaTonya was 21 years old.

According to the petition, the Floyds were married on June 10, 1966, a little more than a year before their daughter, LaTonya, was born on June 16, 1967. They separated on October 23, 1987. In his answer, Floyd agreed with all conditions of the divorce, except that Peggy was entitled to more than half of the marital property. Peggy failed to file financial information with the court in a timely fashion – including five years of tax returns and bank documents – which led to a motion for sanction. After complying, the matter was settled quickly, and it appears that Floyd paid her for a portion of the home, as he continues to reside there.

Civil

In 2004, Floyd was sued by a Guardian Ad Litem, who represented a 12-year-old boy who was injured when Floyd was backing out of this his driveway.

 - Settled for \$4,307.51 and \$2,536 for attorney's fees

According to the complaint, Floyd back his Nissan onto Seneca Drive and hit 12-year-old Johnathan Scott, who was riding a bicycle in the street. Scott's injuries included a strained back, contusions on his legs and knees, and a split chin requiring stitches. While he recovered, he has a permanent scar on his chin. In addition to requesting \$3,300.29 in medical fees, his counsel requested \$10,000 in attorney's fees.

On October 19, 2004, the parties settled out of court for \$4,307.51, which included information about contributory negligence by Scott. \$2,536 was earmarked for attorney's fees for Smith, Dickey, Hasty & Dempster PA.

Ethics Issues

Beginning almost immediately after establishing his committee, Floyd began receiving correspondence indicating problems. His daughter, LaTonya served as his Treasurer, and on July 1, 2002, the State Board of Elections requested clarification to ensure she was not his wife. Also, initially Floyd filed notice that his contributions would remain under the \$3,000 threshold, but when they exceeded that amount, they failed to file a new Statement of Organization.

Additional notices include:

- July 31, 2008 – Filed Second Quarter Report one day late resulting in a \$50 penalty. The State Board of Elections waived the fine.
- October 20, 2010 – Floyd received two penalties for not filing 48-hour notices in April 2010 resulting in two \$500 penalties, the first of which was waived
 - On December 13, 2011, Floyd’s campaign signed a Penalty Resolution Agreement settling this penalty for \$50
- On July 28, 2013, LaTonya filed a notice with their report saying that the official report indicates a negative balance (-\$1,440.54), but that their bank account has \$2,602.96. LaTonya was working to figure out where the discrepancy lies
- On April 29, 2016, Floyd filed his first quarter report one day late resulting in a \$50 penalty that was automatically waived
- An audit conducted on September 26, 2017, shows numerous discrepancies in the accounting and reporting of totals during 2013. Between March 2017 and July 2017, the State Board of Elections was in contact with Floyd’s committee on 12 occasions to fix the issues.
- On June 4, 2019, the North Carolina State Board of Elections conducted an audit of Floyd’s campaign reports and found issues with the name of a committee reported as contributing to him. It was corrected.
- An audit completed on November 12, 2020 showed a minor issue with a campaign contribution not reporting in filings by the other committee.
- Floyd’s committee was late to file their 2021 mid-year report, resulting in a \$50 penalty that was waived
