Summary of Findings

Julie Marie Olson-Von Haefen is a 52-year-old two-term North Carolina House Member, who was previously a homemaker and PTA representative, who resides in Apex, NC. An attorney by education and former registration, Von Haefen permitted her license to lapse following the birth of her three children, who are 13, 11, and 9 years old. She proudly describes them as attendees of North Carolina public schools. Von Haefen is married to Dr. Roger Von Haefen, PhD., an associate professor of environmental and resource economy at North Carolina State University in Raleigh, where he is described as teaching undergraduate and graduate courses in environmental and natural resource economics and applied econometrics.

Previously, the Von Haefens lived in California, Arizona, and Ohio, and Von Haefen had attorney registrations in each state; however, she never petitioned or sat for the bar in North Carolina. We did not find any professional licenses in North Carolina for her in any profession.

Our searches did not yield any matches to any potential legal or financial problems in North Carolina. In addition to the sole parcel Von Haefen listed in 2018, they purchased a vacation home in Avery County, NC in mid 2021, paying cash. They also appear to list just a line of credit on their primary residence that allows them to borrow up to \$54,000. We found no indication of late payments on property taxes, and they do not appear in the statewide legal database. In 2009, they financed a new furnace system for their home, and they paid it off a year later. According to her financial disclosure, they have one debt (besides their primary mortgage) with a commercial bank (Bank of America) that exceeds \$10,000.

In 2018, Von Haefen was a political newcomer. Since establishing a campaign committee in early 2018, she reported raising more than \$1.2 million, including more than \$600,000 during the third quarter of 2018. She listed more than \$680,000 received from Democratic candidates and committees through her committee. During an audit, the North Carolina State Board of Elections found a non-itemized contribution totaling \$85, which exceeded the threshold for reporting. Her committee was forced to surrender the money. At the close of the June 2022 reporting period, Von Haefen disclosed more than \$100,000 cash on hand.

Von Haefen's federal contributions total less than \$1,200 and are comprised of nearly 100 small-dollar contributions – mostly through ActBlue and Swing Left. She gave a combined \$115 to Hillary for America. In North Carolina, her \$7,000 in contributions also include about \$5,800 given to her own committee for North Carolina House.

Biography

Julie von Haefen, is a Parent Teacher Association (PTA) leader at the school, county and state level and a fierce advocate for North Carolina's public schools, she is running for the North Carolina State House of Representatives in the 36th District.

Julie and her husband, Dr. Roger von Haefen, a professor at NC State University, moved to Apex in 2005 and have lived in House District 36 for 13 years. They have three children, ages 13, 11 and 9, all of whom are students in the Wake County Public School System.

Julie became involved in her local PTA when the oldest of her three children entered the Wake County Public School System. She went on to become the PTA President at Washington GT Magnet Elementary School in Raleigh for two years. She currently serves as the President of the Wake County PTA Council.

In addition to her work with PTA, Julie is a certified Guardian ad Litem in Wake County and is a Meals on Wheels volunteer. Julie and her family are members of St. Andrew's Catholic Church in Apex. She received her bachelor's degree from Ohio University and her law degree from Case Western Reserve University. She practiced law for 10 years in a variety of areas including criminal law, medical malpractice defense, municipal law and education law.

A 2022 version of her biography details her work as a legislator since January 2019.

Julie von Haefen represents the 36th District in the North Carolina House of Representatives. She serves on the Appropriations, Appropriations General

Government, State Government, Local Government, and Homeland Security/Military/Veterans Affairs committees.

Julie and her husband, Dr. Roger von Haefen, a professor at NC State University, moved to Apex and District 36 in 2005. They have three children, all of whom are students in the Wake County Public School System.

Julie was a Parent Teacher Association (PTA) leader at the school, county and state level and is a fierce advocate for North Carolina's public schools. She became involved in her local PTA when the oldest of her three children entered the Wake County Public School System. She went on to become the PTA President at Washington GT Magnet Elementary School in Raleigh for two years. She served as the President of the Wake County PTA Council from 2017-2018 and served on the Board of Directors for five years. Julie also served on the North Carolina PTA Board of Directors from 2017-2019 and was the State Advocacy Chair and Federal Legislative Chair for NCPTA. She is still a proud member of the PTA at the three schools her children attend.

In addition to her work with PTA, Julie is a certified Guardian ad Litem in Wake County and is a longtime Meals on Wheels volunteer. She is a substitute teacher with Wake County Public Schools and has worked at several schools in District 36.

Julie received her bachelor's degree from Ohio University and her law degree from Case Western Reserve University. She practiced law for over 10 years in a variety of areas including criminal law, medical malpractice defense, municipal law and education law. She is licensed to practice law in Ohio, Arizona and California.

Julie has served as the State Representative for District 36 since January 1, 2019.

Professional License

We did not find any indication that Von Haefen ever sat for the bar exam or was licensed to practice law in the State of North Carolina.

Von Haefen was admitted to the California Bar Association on June 2, 2004 (ID: 230688). She entered into inactive status on January 1, 2005. She was not the subject of any disciplinary action during the time she was licensed.

Von Haefen was admitted to practice law in the State of Arizona on May 23, 2003. She is currently in inactive status.

Von Haefen was admitted to practice law in the State of Ohio on November 13, 1995 (ID: 65141). She is currently in inactive status.

According to these record, she attended Case Western Reserve University School of Law in Cleveland, OH.

Marriage

Von Haefen and her husband were married in Hamilton County, Ohio on November 9, 2002. At the time of the wedding, he was 32 years old, and she was 31 years old.

Voter Registration

Von Haefen registered to vote in Wake County on July 11, 2005 as a member of the Democratic Party (ID: 000099944981). Her registration document indicates that she was born in Michigan.

Since that time, she participated in 27 elections, skipping mid-term primaries in 2006 and 2010.

Von Haefen completed and submitted a statement of economic interest with the North Carolina Ethics Commission covering calendar years 2017 to 2021.

Von Haefen's husband Roger is employed as a professor at North Carolina State University.

None of their three children - BGV (son), CMV (daughter), an KDV (daughter) - have jobs.

The Von Haefens share 100% ownership of a home in Apex, Wake County. In 2021, they reported an additional parcel in Newland, NC (in Avery County).

Von Haefen established a campaign finance committee – Comm to Elect Julie Von Haefen (ID: STA-TL1LLR-C-001) – with the North Carolina State Board of Elections on February 20, 2018. Since that time, she raised more than \$1.2 million and currently shows just more than \$100,000 cash on hand.

Compliance/Ethics Problems

A June 12, 2019 audit conducted by the North Carolina State Board of Elections showed a miscellaneous, non-itemized contribution totaling \$85. Because it exceeded the \$50 threshold, Von Haefen was forced to surrender the money.

Election Results

2018 General Election

After running unopposed in the Democratic primary for House, Von Haefen barely defeated Nelson Dollar in the general election. Dollar lost 3% of the vote to Robyn Haley Pegram, a Libertarian candidate.
